T11.3 FC-FS-6 ad hoc work group regular meeting
08 April 2019 – 02:30PM – 05:00PM EDT
Virtual Conference

The FC-FS-6 ad hoc work group of the Fibre Channel Protocol (T11.3) Task Group held a regular meeting via virtual conferencing using the Zoom platform on 08 April 2020, hosted by Marvell. Attendance was 15 people from 10 organizations and is tabulated at the end of this document.

1 Opening remarks & Introductions

Chairperson Dave Peterson (Broadcom) opened the regular meeting Wednesday, 08 April 2020 at 02:30 PM EDT. He thanked our host organization, Marvell, for setting up the Zoom meeting and led a round of introductions.

1.1 Attendance and Membership

The chair explained that attendance is recorded electronically at www.incits.org, and explained the procedure. Attendance at this meeting does not count toward attendance at the plenaries of T11 and its task groups (i.e., being here will not get you out or keep you out of membership jeopardy). The chair stated that all persons present are considered members of this meeting and may vote on questions, limited to one vote per company present. He advised that although T11 does not limit participation in the activities of its work groups to representatives of T11 member organizations, it requires nonmembers to identify themselves as such. Nonmembers that expect they may participate in the activities of T11 regularly were encouraged to become members.

1.2 Patents

The chair indicated that among the rules and policies under which this working group operates are the ANSI intellectual property policies as specified in pages 1-3 of http://www.incits.org/pat_slides.pdf. He displayed these pages without comment or explanation, and directed that questions about the policy should be referred to the questioner's legal counsel or the ANSI General Counsel.

1.3 Antitrust

The chair indicated that among the rules and policies under which this working group operates are the INCITS Antitrust Guidelines. Any member of the meeting is responsible for objecting if he believes discussion in the meeting violates those guidelines. As examples, there should never be discussion of the following topics at any INCITS or INCITS subgroup meeting:

- Any company's prices or pricing policies;
- Specific R&D, sales and marketing plans;
- Any company's confidential product, product development or production strategies;
- Whether certain suppliers or customers will be served;
- Prices paid to input sources; or
- Complaints about individual firms or other actions that might tend to hinder a competitor in any market.

If such discussion is not immediately terminated, it is the chairperson's responsibility to terminate the meeting. The INCITS Antitrust Guidelines are available at <http://www.incits.org/inatrust.htm>.

He decided to tell the story, by describing what each part of the graphs represent in words. He also tried to simplify down and cover more examples in a single graph. Much more English....much clearer.

Dave Peterson brought up the current Annex and after discussion it was agreed that we should just remove it now.

5.1 Congestion Management Informative Annex Diagrams (2020-00068-v000) Johnson (Broadcom)

After showing the changes discussed in Section 4.1, Howard went back to these diagrams to ask which of these we also truly need to include in the informative annex.

Figure D.8 was one that was noted as showing something sufficiently different to also be included. In particular there may need to be more explanation around the different implementation choices that are all legal.

There was also considerable discussion around the notion of whether a Warning signal **MUST** be sent before an alarm signal. Based on sample frequency, an implementation may not know a warning level was crossed until it takes a sample, at which point the alarm threshold could have been crossed. Today T0 is defined as when the Warning threshold is reached, but it may need to be changed to be the first sample measurement when either threshold was crossed. TBD
