The FC-FS-5 ad hoc work group of the Fibre Channel Protocol (T11.3) Task Group held a regular meeting at Ft. Worth, Texas on 06 February 2018, hosted by Data Center Systems (DCS). Attendance was 19 people from 11 organizations and is tabulated at the end of this document.

1 Opening remarks & Introductions

Chairperson Dave Peterson (Broadcom) opened the regular meeting Tuesday, 06 February 2018 at 10:01 AM CST. He thanked our host organization, Data Center Systems (DCS), and led a round of introductions.

1.1 Attendance and Membership

The chair explained that attendance is recorded electronically at www.incits.org, and explained the procedure. Attendance at this meeting does not count toward attendance at the plenaries of T11 and its task groups (i.e., being here will not get you out or keep you out of membership jeopardy). The chair stated that all persons present are considered members of this meeting and may vote on questions, limited to one vote per company present. He advised that although T11 does not limit participation in the activities of its work groups to representatives of T11 member organizations, it requires nonmembers to identify themselves as such. Nonmembers that expect they may participate in the activities of T11 regularly were encouraged to become members.

1.2 Patents

The chair indicated that among the rules and policies under which this working group operates are the ANSI intellectual property policies as specified in pages 1-3 of http://www.incits.org/pat_slides.pdf. He displayed these pages without comment or explanation, and directed that questions about the policy should be referred to the questioner's legal counsel or the ANSI General Counsel.

1.3 Antitrust

The chair indicated that among the rules and policies under which this working group operates are the INCITS Antitrust Guidelines. Any member of the meeting is responsible for objecting if he believes discussion in the meeting violates those guidelines. As examples, there should never be discussion of the following topics at any INCITS or INCITS subgroup meeting:

- Any company's prices or pricing policies;
- Specific R&D, sales and marketing plans;
- Any company's confidential product, product development or production strategies;
- Whether certain suppliers or customers will be served;
- Prices paid to input sources; or
- Complaints about individual firms or other actions that might tend to hinder a competitor in any market.

If such discussion is not immediately terminated, it is the chairperson's responsibility to terminate the meeting. The INCITS Antitrust Guidelines are available at <http://www.incits.org/inatrust.htm>.

4.1 ABTS and RRQ discussion – (2017-00238-v000) Peterson (Broadcom)

This discussion was deferred again to the next meeting.

5.0 Scheduled Business

5.1 RFC Ballot Resolution (T11-2018-00002-v001)

Craig reviewed the spreadsheet of letter ballot comments received and worked through them individually towards resolution. All of the comments were reviewed, with some remaining open to be addressed over the coming months in preparation for the April meeting. Resolutions are documented in a revision of the above document.

5.2 NVMe Queuing (T11-2018-00031-v000) - Bharadwaj (Cisco)

Harsha presented a proposal to change to FC-FS related to the NVMe queuing proposal that crosses multiple FC standard working groups. He feels that the current wording for Priority for Value 0 is confusing...today it indicates 'no priority'. Yet it is also described as meaning 'best effort' in Section 12.5.1.1 (where CS_CTL is defined). Harsha proposed wording changes to Section 12. 5.2 such that the phrase "that no priority has been assigned to the frame" be changed to say "that no priority has been assigned to the frame or is mapped to the "Best-Effort" priority class". Harsha showed that in FC-LS when it talks about QoS Priority (under Table 169, for Extensions to Priority Tagging) it describes a value of 00h as "No QoS priority provided (i.e. best effort)". However Howard pointed out that this section is about a specific implementation/use case of the priority field. The group seemed to feel that 'no priority has been assigned' is sufficient, and allows the implementer to do as they see fit. For NVMe, which is the target of Harsha's concern, we should be explicit about the value of 0 in that context/spec, but group consensus is that we don't need to change the base definition here in FC-FS.
